The NFRW Americanism Committee has arranged a guided tour of the National World War I Museum and Liberty Memorial Tower.

Cost is approximately: \$25.00 and includes tickets to the museum and transportation.

Reservations are necessary and will be binding.

The National World War I Museum is a memorial to American soldiers who fought courageously in the war to end all wars.

Discover one-of-a-kind artifacts, including a 1917 original Harley-Davidson motorcycle, General Pershing's headquarters flag, and wool socks knitted by first lady Edith Wilson.

Visit the Liberty Memorial Tower, a 217-foot tower built by the citizens of Kansas City and dedicated in 1926 by President Calvin Coolidge to honor those who served in the defense of liberty.

A ramped walkway leads down to the museum and up to the tower and its deck. To reach the top of the Liberty Memorial Tower, visitors must ride an elevator and then climb 45 stairs, where they will enjoy a wonderful view of Kansas City.

The guided tour is approximately two hours. The group will meet in the lobby of the Downtown Marriott at 9:30 a.m. Cameras are permitted.

For those wanting to return to the museum, tickets are good for two days.
