

CARLYLE GREGORY

Building upon years of first-hand experience in political campaigns, Republican organizations and the White House, Carlyle Gregory established The Carlyle Gregory Company, a Northern Virginia based public relations and political consulting firm, in 1989.

Gregory began his political career in 1972 as Chairman of the Virginia College Republicans. He coordinated Congressman Caldwell Butler's winning reelection campaign in 1974 and organized Virginia Congressman Paul Trible's campaign in 1976. In 1978 he managed Newt Gingrich's first successful bid for Congress, and served as a Field Director for the National Republican Congressional Committee from 1981-1985. In 1987, his extensive political experience earned him a position in the White House, where he served as a Special Assistant for Political Affairs under President Reagan.

As President of the Carlyle Gregory Company, he has worked with dozens of successful campaigns. Recent clients include, U.S. Rep. Tom DeLay, U.S. Rep. Randy Forbes, U.S. Rep. Clay Shaw, U.S. Rep. Dan Miller, U.S. Rep. Ed Schrock, U.S. Rep. Ric Keller, U.S. Senator Roger Wicker, the Susan B. Anthony List, JP Morgan Chase PAC, the Mississippi Republican Party and Virginia Delegates Preston Bryant, Terrie Suit, Phil Larabee, Beverly Sherwood, Danny Marshall and Rob Bell.

Gregory's experience extends outside the Washington Beltway and beyond the boundaries of the United States. In 1990, Gregory served on a team of consultants sent to Romania by the International Republican Institute to assist the pro-democracy forces in that country. He visited Bulgaria in 1994 and traveled twice to Russia in 1995 on similar missions.

Gregory was the first President of the American Campaign Academy (1985-86), served as a consultant to the RNC's Campaign Management Colleges (1988-92), lectured extensively at the National Federation of Republican Women Campaign Management Seminars (1988-94), and taught classes for GOPAC (1992-96), the Leadership Institute (1997-2009) and the Susan B. Anthony List schools (1998-2009). He has also lectured at American University, George Washington University, Harvard and Georgetown University, and has participated in AMPAC training programs for over ten years.

A graduate of Blacksburg High School and Washington and Lee University, Gregory is a native Virginian and an Elder in the Presbyterian Church. He and his wife, Margaret, are the proud parents of two very active children.
