Capitol Impact, LLC is a lobbying affiliate of The Livingston Group, a comprehensive public affairs and government relations firm headed by the former Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the United States House of Representatives, Congressman Bob Livingston.

Immediately prior to starting Capitol Impact, Marjorie was a Vice President at a lobbying firm securing appropriations for colleges, hospitals and nonprofits.

As chief of staff and campaign manager for U.S. Rep. Heather Wilson (R-NM), Marjorie served as the Congresswoman's principal political, communications and policy advisor, managed 22 staff members and a team of four consultants, and worked with constituents and House colleagues.

Prior to joining Rep. Wilson's staff, Marjorie served as Vice President of Ally Development and Mobilization at a leading Washington public affairs firm, where she developed grassroots and coalition strategies for corporations to impact public policy. During the 1998 election cycle, Marjorie worked to re-elect Members of Congress as the director of incumbent retention for the National Republican Congressional Committee. Prior to that, she was chief of staff and campaign manager for U.S. Rep. Randy Tate (R-WA), helping him to win his seat by defeating an incumbent.

In 1993, Marjorie worked with then-State Rep. Randy Tate on an initiative to roll back tax increases. Though the initiative was defeated, it gained enough momentum to ensure that the state legislature rolled-back the tax increases during the following Legislative Session. Prior to that, Marjorie worked as field director for the House Republican Organizational Committee helping to elect Republicans to the Washington State House of Representatives, a position she was chosen for after working with the House Republican Caucus.

Marjorie is a graduate of the University of Arizona. She has taught at campaign schools throughout the United States, Europe and Africa. Prior to its cancellation, Marjorie appeared several times on Politically Incorrect with Bill Maher.
