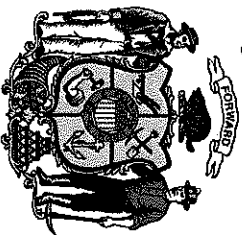


# STATE of WISCONSIN

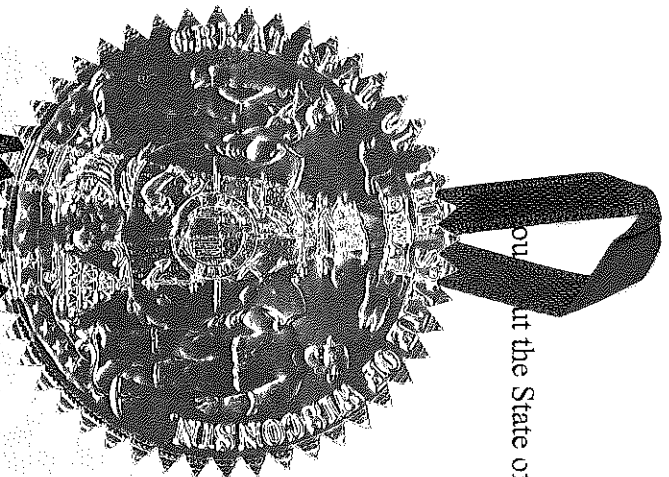
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
